Eric Clary was born and raised in Gallia County. He has been married to his wife Paula for the past 23 years and they have two children, Michaela (18) and Wyatt (13). After graduating from Gallia Academy and Buckeye Hills Career Center, he started his career in the HVAC field. He moved his growing family to North Carolina in 2000 after accepting a job at Nucor Steel Plate Mill in Hertford County, North Carolina. In 2002 he was promoted to HVAC Supervisor where he learned to deal with many different situations and personalities over that time. A work related MVA in 2007 cut his HVAC career short and it was decided that the family move back home after 10 months of surgeries and rehab. After moving back to Gallia County, he wanted to follow his passion for wildlife conservation and continued his involvement with the Gallia County Conservation Club where he has attended meetings since he was a child in the 1970's and a member since 1988. In 2014 he became Treasurer and Grant

Coordinator for the Club and still holds that position. Eric has also taken up many different volunteer positions since moving back. He is a Hunter Education Instructor for the Ohio Division of Wildlife, a NASP (National Archery in the Schools Program) Basic Archery Instructor, and a Passport to Fishing Instructor. Over the years he, along with the Gallia SWCD, held classes on all of these for children at the local schools as well as different events throughout the year, for 500-1000 kids annually. Eric has been a volunteer for the OSU Extension Office for many years and is a 4-H Advisor for the Gallia Shooting Aces 4-H Club. This is a new shooting sports club, where he is also a certified 4-H Instructor in Archery, Pistol, and Shotgun. He volunteers many days at Canter's Cave 4-H Camp during the year and truly enjoys all his time that is spent helping the kids and fellow advisors. With the help of the Gallia SWCD and OSU Extension, Eric coordinated the new Land Lab area at the Gallia County Fairgrounds pond. This new shelter and its surroundings will offer Conservation and Education events for years to come, and Eric hopes this will teach our children on the importance of a clean, well balanced, and productive environment. Eric is also a proud member of Morning Dawn #7 F&AM, the Valley of Gallipolis AASR, and the Gallipolis Elks #107.



Kyle Deel and his wife Sarah reside in Vinton, Ohio, with their three children Logan, Lane, and Lucy Deel, being the 3rd generation to operate the family farm. Kyle has been very active in the community where he served on the Gallia County Fair Board for 12 years. He has been a 4-H advisor for the past 9 years, and coaches several youth sports teams. Kyle was very active in 4-H and FFA growing up which led him in to the show pig business. The family currently houses 45 sows and sells showpigs to many parts of the country. They currently run 30 commercial cows on the original part of the family farm. They currently grow 100 acres of row crops along with Kyle's parents, Fred and Mary Deel, where they practice no-till conservation and minimum till. Kyle and Sarah are currently working on several upgrades to

the farm including rotational grazing, spring development, waterline and tanks, and a heavy use pad with a service road.



Danielle Sanders lives on a small productive farm in Gallia County with a hand full of brood commercial beef cows and has worked with hundreds of replacement dairy females at all stages of age, from bottle calves to breed ready yearlings. Her past work has also included working with a herd of brood ewes, where she helped with lambing and everyday care. She has a good understanding of using farm equipment such as tractors, hay equipment (wet wrapping and dry), skid steers, and much more. She is employed at Gallia County Department of Job and Family Services. She is currently the Secretary of the Gallia County Cattlemen's Association and an adult advisor for the Gallia County Jr fair youth board. She graduated from the University of Rio Grande with a bachelor's degree in Accounting. She was very active in 4-H, showing cattle each year. She was a four year member of the Gallipolis FFA Chapter where she served as Sentinel and Treasurer. She also participated in soil judging, livestock judging, and the parliamentary procedure team. She earned her State and American FFA degrees with Market steers and working on a small family farm in Gallia County.

Ohio NRCS Announces New EQIP Application Deadline

COLUMBUS, OH, Sept. 11, 2018 – The U.S. Department of Agriculture's Natural Resources Conservation Service (NRCS) announced **Friday**, **October 19**, **2018**, as the deadline to submit applications for the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP) in Ohio.

EQIP is a voluntary conservation program which helps producers make conservation work for them. Together, NRCS and producers invest in solutions that conserve natural resources for the future while also improving agricultural operations. Through EQIP, NRCS provides agricultural producers with financial resources and one-on-one help to plan and implement improvements, or what NRCS calls conservation practices. Using these practices can lead to cleaner water and air, healthier soil and better wildlife habitat, all while improving agricultural operations. Through EQIP, you can voluntarily implement conservation practices, and NRCS co-invests in these practices with you. Financial assistance is now available in a variety of agricultural categories such as cropland, forestry, pasture operations, and organic. Several special projects are also available which address water quality, forestry management, improving pollinator populations, applying best management practices and many more. All available agricultural categories are listed on the Ohio NRCS website under "EQIP Application Deadlines." To participate in USDA conservation programs, applicants should be farmers or farm or forest landowners and must meet eligibility criteria. Applications signed and submitted to NRCS by the October 19 deadline will be evaluated for fiscal year 2019 funding.
